



Target 5: Non-count Nouns and Plural Verbs Questions

Count nouns are nouns that can be counted. Count nouns can be either singular or plural, and they can use either singular or plural verbs.

Singular The *client* has his invitation.

Plural The *clients* have their invitations.

Non-count nouns are nouns that cannot be counted. Non-count nouns do not have plural forms and therefore cannot use plural verbs.

Singular Quality is our goal.

Non-count nouns use singular verbs.

Problem A non-count noun has a plural verb.

Solution Use a singular verb with the non-count noun, or add a countable

quantity.

Examples

Incorrect: Confidence are reassuring to clients.

Correct: Confidence is reassuring to clients.

Explanation: Confidence is a non-count noun, It never has a plural form,

and always uses a singular verb. Change the verb to is.

Incorrect: The new furnitures look good in the lobby.

Correct: The furniture looks good in the lobby.

Explanation: Furniture is a non-count noun. It never has a plural form, and

always uses a singular verb. Change the verb to looks.

Non-count: The new furniture looks good in the lobby.

Count: The new pieces of furniture look good in the lobby.

Explanation: Use a countable quantity with a non-count noun. You cannot

count furniture, but you can count pieces because pieces is

plural, use a plural verb.

Target 6: Differences in Meaning Between Count and Non-count Nouns

Problem Some nouns have different count and non-count meanings.

Solution Pay attention to the meanings of the noun.

Examples

Incorrect: Fish is swimming in the office pond.

Correct: Ten fish are swimming in the office pond. (count)

Correct: Fish makes a healthy dinner. (non-count)

Non-count

Fish makes a healthy dinner.

Count

Ten fish are swimming in the office pond.

Explanation:

Ten fish is countable because it means ten individual living things. Fish for dinner is a non-count noun like food. Nouns,

such as light or hair, change meanings depending on

whether they are count or non-count nouns.

Examples

Incorrect: There's not enough light to read.

Correct:

The street lights go on at dusk.

Incorrect:

The shop sells many different wool.

Correct:

The shop sells many different wools. (count)

Correct:

The shop sells many different kinds of wool. (non-count)

Non-count

The shop sells many different kinds of wool.

Count

The shop sells many different wools.

Explanation:

The non-count noun wool can be a plural count noun when it

refers to different varieties of wool. The non-count wool can

be used with a countable quantity kinds of.
